## Reimagining Vessels : What Moves Us across the Sea ?



Edouard Duval-Carrié is a Haitian artist, currently residing in Miami. He fled Haiti for Puerto Rico during the Duvalier dictatorship before studying art in Montreal and at the Ecole Nationale des Beaux-Arts in Paris. If all these different places and identities shaped his artistic sensitivity and cosmopolitan art, Duval-Carrié remains however close to his native Haiti. His internationally celebrated works are derived from Caribbean history, politics and religion. His art notably discusses global paths of migration, questions the Western canon and reveals how the Caribbean has shaped the modern world. Duval-Carrié will be talking about his life and work at UAB.
