Lafayette in Alabama

When the French boy general helped 13 American colonies gain their independence from Great Britain, Alabama was part of a large territory to the west. When he came to America for a final visit at age 67 from July 1824 to September 1825, Alabama had been a state since 1819, and it had a frontier river capital named Cahawba. When the marquis landed at Cahawba on April 5, 1825, he was greeted like a rock star.
